

Why is it that it feels good when we give to someone something? Why is it that serving others gives us a sense of satisfaction and joy? Giving, after all, is not easy. It requires time and effort and sacrifice. So why is it so satisfying?

God is the Ultimate Giver. All that exists comes from God. Our life, our relationships, our abilities, and our very being are the result of divine giving. But every so often we have a chance to be like God by being *Givers* ourselves: It can be as parents, nurturing new lives in a son or daughter; It can be as children, caring for an aging parent; and it can be as a forgiving friend so that a relationship can continue to flourish.

Giving is divine. It enables us to participate in God's action of creating, saving, and loving. That is why it feels so good.

With this understanding, we will approach today's Gospel. The disciples, James and John come to Jesus, clarifying their role in His mission by asking to sit at Jesus' right and left! Now there's nothing wrong in asking Jesus for this. Sitting with Jesus in glory is a good thing, and we believe that James and John are sitting there right now. But note Jesus' response: *"You will, indeed, sit with me in glory. But I can offer you something more. I can offer you to be like God. If you drink this cup that I drink, if you serve the least among you, then the lives that you will change, the hope that you will revive, the joy that you will instill in others will overshadow whatever seats you receive in the kingdom"*.

You see, James and John did not recognize Jesus' call for them to something greater. They would, indeed, sit in the kingdom but they were called to participate in God's action of transforming the world. Their flaw, was that they did not understand and did not recognize that following Jesus allowed them to do what God does and that in that action of service they would find the greatest joy.

The Gospel, then, calls us to value opportunities to give. Indeed, our primary stance is to be receivers, to accept from God all that is given with thankfulness. But also, to never miss the opportunity to do what God does - GIVE.

Giving is our chance to participate in the power and the love that shapes creation, and an opportunity to catch a glimpse of the joy and the beauty of God.

Wednesday 24th to Friday, 26th October
Cardinal Nicholas Wiseman, first Archbishop
of Westminster, England, observed of the
Forty Hours:

"In no other time or place, is the sublimity of our religion so touchingly felt. No ceremony is going forward in the sanctuary, no sound of song is issuing from the choir, no voice of exhortation proceeds from the pulpit, no prayer is uttered aloud at the altar. Each heart and soul is alone; each uttering its own thoughts, each feeling its own grace. Yet you are overpowered, subdued, quelled, into a reverential mood, softened into a devotional spirit, forced to meditate, to feel, to pray. The little children who come in, led by a mother's hand, kneel down by her in silence, as she simply points toward the altar, overawed by the still splendour before them: the very babe seems hushed to quiet reverence in her bosom."


